Present: 19 members 5 apologies.

V. P. was accepted as a new member to the acclamation of those present.

NAA report: This year, in AUGUST, will be our 1000th meeting, held in conjunction with NAA convention at the Naval, Military & Airforce Club, which Barrie has kindly helped to organize. This event will include a Numismatic Bourse on the Friday and is a chance to look at numismatics and speak with other collectors from around Australia. The NAA convention is a chance to further your numismatic knowledge by attending talks about Numismatics that other people give. 12 people have so far submitted papers (talks on various numismatic subjects) for this event.

Our 1000th meeting will be held on FRIDAY 18th August at the Naval, Military and Airforce Club, rather than the usual third Thursday at our usual meeting place.

Coin Expo report: DEW has confirmed our booking for our 6th Coin & Banknote Expo, to be held Sat/Sun 7-8th October at the Torrens Parade Ground, corner of King William Street and Victoria Drive behind Government House, Adelaide. Enter parking area off Victoria Drive.

Volunteers are asked to buy plain black or blue shirts of the type shown by J. W. and bring them to the next meeting to be inscribed. The society will meet the cost of the shirts and inscriptions.

Before the June meeting, at approx 7pm, there will be an informal meeting for anyone to talk about the arrangements for the Coin Expo.

General Business: Members agreed to continue the NSSA subscription to the Australian Coin Review when it comes up for renewal. The ACR is a continuation of the CAB magazine which was recently sold to Cotton & Co. Although it is more expensive than the CAB magazine, we hope to be able to access digitized records of all Coin Review and CAB magazines since 1964.

Numismatics:

Mick showed and spoke about a range of **shredded banknotes** of various types, some of which were donated to him when he ran his Banking and Currency Museum from 1988 to 2008.

The next image shows shredded N.Z. paper notes originally held in reserve for the possible Millennium Bug, which did not occur. The second image is Australian \$2 confetti.



Paul S. showed a pair of copies of **Scottish Alexander III silver pennies**, originally issued in the 13th century. These examples were made in 2011 during a visit to Scotland.



Payl J. showed Ancient Roman silver denarius of M. Furius c 120BC, also a pair of silver denarius of G.Cassius Longinus circa 42 BC.




B. T. spoke about an error 2016 5c coin with die clash, known as the "Alien 5c coin" He has looked through many thousands of 2016 5c coins to find a few of these error types. Two antennae appear below The Queen.





Richard showed an **Alexander The Great** (336-323 BC) silver drachm and a gold coin of Anastasius, 1st Byzantine ruler 491-518 AD.







G. R. showed a 1999 Volunteers \$1 coin with smoothed edges, a **1977 50c with golden toning** and a 1955 halfpenny which has been clipped at the base. V. P. showed 2014 \$1 Anzac and 2014 \$1 mob of **kangaroos** coins and **2020** Donation dollar.





L. G. showed a 1992 \$5 polymer note with scratches and a **Bank of Australasia One Pound** Private banknote, dated Wellington, July 1913. A 1915 issued note is illustrated.

Steve and Helen showed and spoke about examples of **2023 Vietnam**, **50**th **Anniversary** of end of Australian involvement \$2 coloured coins. The colours on the coin reflect the colours of the three medal ribbons awarded to Australians for their service in this conflict.

Mick showed and spoke about his new book Australian decimal banknotes & designs in colour and showed some examples of unissued decimal notes including One & Twenty Royals unissued designs.

Gerry spoke about 1920 Australian shillings, MS63 & MS66 as shown to members.



Richard showed a 1811 Gold 20 Francs of Napoleon Bonaparte.

Helen showed a 5 oz .999 silver coin from 2016 World Money Fair Berlin issue from Niue commemorating the 50th Anniversary of Australian Decimal currency.









Allan showed 2023 \$2 Vegemite coins and \$1 AFL 2023 issued coins.

Kevin showed a 1970 GB & Northern Ireland proof set, the last year of pre-decimal currency for these countries.



P. J. showed and spoke about 2023 GB Charles III Coronation Crown and 50p coins.

Before the meeting, at approx..7pm, there was a meeting of the executive where it was agreed to subsidize the cost for NSSA members to attend the NAA conference and also some discussion about our future monthly meeting venue.

The Expo is fully booked and the Royal Australian Mint may attend – yet to be confirmed. We will be producing Expo PNCs for the event, more detail on this to be announced. Times open to the public will be 10am to 5pm on Saturday and 10am until 4pm on Sunday.

General Business: Change of Venue. The SA Museum suddenly decided to refuse us parking near the Royal Society rooms venue, after allowing it for decades. This caused us to seek an alternative venue and it was agreed at the meeting by a majority vote to hold future meetings at the Naval & Military Club, 111 Hutt St Adelaide. Gerard made some generous numismatic donations to two members at the meeting.

Numismatics:







Because of recent suggestions that Breaker Morant's name should be included on Boer War memorials, Mick spoke about **Breaker Morant** and the Boer War and showed a bounced cheque written by Harry Morant, a range of Boer War medalets and the **Boer War** Statue that was cast in England and shipped to Adelaide. Statue is in front of Government House, Adelaide and cast of horse head is in Ludlow U.K.

Paul J. spoke about and showed examples of **Netherlands coins** used during the **Australian Proclamation** period, including a 1637 Gold Ducat and a 1794 silver guilder. He also circulated a list showing the values placed on Australian Proclamation period coins under the Proclamation of 1800.

Governor King realised that to have an economy he had to have money in the fledgling Colony so he bought in the Australian Proclamation of 1800 and these two coins are part of the Proclamation. The aim of this Proclamation was to keep coins in the Colonies and to stop the removal of currency.

The gold ducat was given a high face value of Nine Shillings Six Pence and the silver Guilder was given a face value of Two Shillings. These coins are part of Australia's early colonial history as proclamation pieces.

Dutch Republic, the Netherlands, Gold Ducat (3.47g, 21mm), 1781,

Obverse: Dutch Knight stands facing to the right, adorned in studded armour and wearing a plumed helmet, wielding sword in his right hand which rests on his shoulder and holding a bundle of seven arrows, which represents the seven united provinces of the Netherlands, date to field either side, legend surrounds, "CONCORDIA RES PAR CRES HOL" translated (*Small things thrive/come to be through unity*).

Reverse: Legend central in five lines within square panel framed within ornate mantle, "MO: ORD: PROVIN. FOEDER BELG· AD LEG· IMP translated (Series of Coinage of the Provincial Federation of Belgium in conformity to the Imperial Law).






NETHERLANDS. Holland, 1794 Silver Guilder 32mm 10.2 grams.

Obverse Crowned lion **Script:** Latin **Lettering:** I Gl.MO ARG ORD FOE BELG WESTF translation: Silver Money by Order of the Federated Low Countries.

Reverse Dutch virgin Script:

Lettering: HAC NITIMVR HANCTVEMVR translation: On her we lean, her we protect.







Richard showed a **1966 \$10 banknote** and spoke about the buying power of a \$10 note from 1966 compared to the buying power of \$10 today. Mick advised that the horizontal boards on the right of the building at top right on the back were in line proving it was genuine. In forgeries they are uneven on the right edge. The forgeries also glowed white under long-wave ultraviolet light - genuine notes do not.

David showed and spoke about **2023 GB Charles III** silvered and bronze medallions produced by the **Auckland Numismatic** Society, each medallion was 38mm diameter and sold out quickly.

NUMISMATIC SOCIETY OF AUCKLAND – CHARLES III CORONATION COMMEMORATIVES



Two medallions, one in bronze and one in silver, both high-lustre finish were commissioned by the Auckland Numismatic Society to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III. They were for sale at their stand at the NZ 2023 International Stamp Exhibition held at the Ellerslie Racecourse from 4th to 6th May 2023 and by all accounts sold out on the second day of the four-day show. Both medallions weigh 26 grams are 38mm in diameter and 4mm thick. Selling for NZ\$30 bronze and NZ\$40 silver, the obverse features Westminster Abbey, the traditional location of coronations with the inscription –

CHARLES III KING OF NEW ZEALAND CORONATION 6 MAY 2023
The reverse has the portraits of Charles I (1626) and Charles II (1661) with words above –
E-MONETA SOCIETAS and below SOCIETY OF NUMISMATIC AUCKLAND

J. T. showed a silver tetradrachm of Alexander the Great, minted at Temnos, circa 188-170 BC.


